

October has been another exciting month here at Paul DeNeui Ministries. The online services continue to grow. During October, incorporated into each service, we started to highlight one of the 66 facilities where we have ministered in the last 12 years. We are learning more and more what we can do with the online services to make the residents feel included and a part of the service. The residents get excited when they see

their facility on the big screen. We produced 8 more services this month. On YouTube we have 76 archived services which are available to be watched at any time.

If you will recall, last year during the month of March I did a Health & Wholeness Tour distributing books and CDs as a result of the nursing care facilities closing due to covid-19. After that we began online services to get back in through the internet. That has been very successful. Since then nursing care facilities have been open and then closed and then open and then closed, so it has been hard to get in even for one service. Our focus has been online services. Last Friday, October 29th, I was able to have a service in Muskogee. As I was driving home, I just had the sense I should be getting back in a few facilities for in-person services. Not like before, because a lot of time is now spent preparing and producing the online services. But I am in the process of reaching out to a few facilities within a fairly close radius. The response has been 100% "come".

One of the things that the residents really liked during the in-person services was the southern gospel specials. As I had been thinking about and wondering what I could do online, I decided to start producing some southern gospel videos. (I talked about this last month.) These will be available on YouTube and will be used in the online services. Last month I produced “The Lighthouse”. This month I completed a song called “I Believe”. The song talks about growing up with stained glass windows of faith. I remember as a child going to church and seeing stain glassed windows all around the church.

At the beginning of 2020 I finished a book called “Heart Fit: spirit, soul, and body”. It explains how to become fit in order to run your race for God. Part of that “being fit” is physical fitness. I understand that if you do not have the ability to “GO” physically, you will be limited in ministry.



I’ve also heard it said, “Everyone should have at least 4 crazy friends.” Well I’ve got more than 4, but these are 2 of the best crazy friends a man could have – Scott Smith and Sam Graves. We are all 3 bikers. They keep me on my bike and that keeps me fit. We were able to get together in October and do a 55 mile ride climbing over 2,400 ft. Back in 2016 I tried riding with Sam, but couldn’t go 3 miles. Together we are helping each other run our race for God. Thanks guys!
